how can we better understand ourselves and others the classical concept of the four temperaments the four personality types characterized as the fiery choleric the airy sanguine the watery phlegmatic and the earthy melancholic has been revered by many significant thinkers over the ages in a refreshing treatment dr childs demonstrates that this ancient doctrine remains relevant to our modern lives he shows how we can recognize the temperaments in others as well as in ourselves and how to understand the ways in which they function understanding their influences can boost personal development and help improve interpersonal relationships conversational in tone and easily digestible this book features fascinating discussions of the relationships between adults of various temperaments childs reviews matters of compatibility in partnership family and workplace situations liberally spicing his commentary with amusing examples of likely scenarios he investigates the origins and manifestations of the temperaments in both their psychological and physiological aspects also included is a section on the temperaments of children along with helpful and practical advice on dealing with individual issues

recently there has been an increased interest in research on personality temperament and behavioral syndromes henceforth to be referred to as personality in nonhuman primates and other animals this follows in part from a general interest in the subject matter and the realization that individual differences once consigned to error terms in statistical analyses are potentially important predictors moderators and mediators of a wide variety of outcomes ranging from the results of experiments to health to enrichment programs unfortunately while there is a burgeoning interest in the subject matter findings have been reported in a diverse number of journals and most of the methodological and statistical approaches were developed in research on human personality the proposed volume seeks to gather submissions from a variety of specialists in research on individual differences in primate temperament personality or behavioral syndromes we anticipate that chapters will cover several areas the first part of this edited volume will focus on methodological considerations including the advantages and disadvantages of different means of assessing these constructs in primates and introduce some statistical approaches that have typically been the domain of human personality research another part of this edited volume will focus on present findings including the physiological and genetic bases of personality dimensions in primates the relationship between personality and age how personality may moderate or impact various outcomes including behavior health and well being in captive and non captive

environments for the third part of the volume we hope to obtain summaries of the existing work of the authors on the evolutionary important of personality dimensions and guideposts for future directions in this new and exciting area of research

temperament and eating characteristics general measures and interrelationships provides a comprehensive description of the various ways people eat and how these individual eating styles relate to personality dr mehrabian introduces a new approach to the study of eating and presents innovative measures of eating and personal temperament based on large samples from normal populations the research calls attention to the complex interrelationship between aspects of the personality and eating general measures of temperament provide a basis for comparing the results of this important effort with past research on arousal temperament and emotions

of the motives skills and experience that operate between leaders and those who are led since power is about decision making it figures not only in official institutions but in other organizations including political parties pressure groups trade associations business enterprises trade unions and many other types of organizations a general theory of the political personality is set forth here lasswell describes the process by which power becomes a value of first importance and the way appropriate skills in exercising power are acquired he shows that special political types such as agitators or administrators are related to basic types of character that contribute to how they lead finally his analysis offers original perspectives to understand democratic leadership lasswell offers definite suggestions for perfecting self observatories in national and world affairs and for forming democratic personalities selecting and training democratic leaders and reducing destructive conflicts in human relationships power and personality followed the author s 1930 work psychopathology and politics which was widely hailed for its pioneering approach power and personality reevaluated the entire issue of the relationship between psychology and politics in the light of subsequent experience and scientific developments since publication of that earlier work lasswell s ideas continue to carry great weight and persuasiveness

depression and personality conceptual and clinical challenges offers an intriguing new look at where we are in understanding the relationship between personality dimensions disorders and mood disorder it is both a cogent update of conceptual models and a clearly written practical guide to the challenges faced every day by clinicians as they treat patients with depression and bipolar disorder laying the groundwork for subsequent chapters the editors emphasize the value of not only robust pharmacotherapy augmented by psychosocial interventions with a focus on the assets rather than the liabilities of a patient s temperament but also of a detailed review of where we are today an introductory overview provides valuable historical perspective on the evolution of personality from humors to body constitution and temperament in 10 informative chapters 22 contributors discuss the neurobiological dimensions of personality focusing on affect related traits as they review the evidence for serotonin and norepinephrine disturbance based on challenge paradigms and the range of models to understand the interrelationship between personality and depression the justification for depressive personality in both categorical terms i e adding to the diagnostic armamentarium of dsm v and dimensional terms focusing on the five factor model to provide a link between several facets of neuroticism and depressive personality disorder the impact of personality on various aspects of treatment filling in a gap in the pharmacotherapy literature by asserting that personality pathology can affect the patient s capacity to seek be engaged in or be compliant with treatment key assessment and treatment issues recommending a multimodal phased treatment approach that involves targeted pharmacotherapy and integrated individual psychotherapy the role of personality disorder in the assessment and treatment of chronic depression with a concise practical overview of medication and psychotherapy issues regarding the role of axis ii disorders and the complex relationship between bipolar disorder and personality factors the complexity involved in adolescent depression with personality disorder providing a conceptual framework for understanding what factors of personality contribute to vulnerability for depression in adolescents and depression in later life including particularly relevant issues such as the role of physical illness and organic factors on the clinical presentation of personality and affective disorder invaluable reading for clinicians and researchers alike depression and personality conceptual and clinical challenges offers fascinating perspectives on the historical antecedents neurobiological dimensions and conceptual models regarding the relationship between personality and depression
